We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Montgomery County Capital Resource Corporation (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the statements of financial position as of December 31, 2015 and 2014, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2015 AND 2014

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

Montgomery County Capital Resource Corporation was established to promote community and economic development and the creation of jobs in the non-profit and for-profit sectors by developing and providing programs for not-for-profit institutions, manufacturing and industrial businesses and other entities to access low interest tax-exempt and non-tax-exempt financing for eligible projects.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash equivalents consist of highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of three months or less, or which are redeemable on demand. Fair value approximates carrying amounts.

Income Taxes

Montgomery County Capital Resource Corporation is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, has made no provisions for taxes in the accompanying financial statements. The Corporation is exempt from filing federal and State income tax returns under IRS Revenue Procedure 95-8.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles requires the use of management's estimates. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 – AGENCY BONDS

Certain industrial development revenue bonds and notes issued by the Corporation are secured by property which is leased or sold to companies and the debt is retired by these payments or installment sale payments. The bonds and notes are not general obligations of the Corporation, but rather are special obligations of the Corporation, payable solely from the Corporation's interest in the assets (real property and equipment) being financed. The Corporation does not record the assets or liabilities resulting from completed bonds and notes issued in its accounts, since its primary function is to act as a financing conduit between the borrowing companies and the bond and note holders, and the funds arising there from are controlled by trustees or banks acting as fiscal agents. For providing this service, the Corporation receives bond administration fees from the borrowing companies. Such administrative fee income is recognized when received. On September 17, 2014, the Corporation issued one such bond for \$24,808,627 and received agency fees in the amount of \$229,750. The outstanding balance on December 31, 2015 was \$22,325,000.

NOTE 3 – CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

The Corporation maintains its cash balances in one financial institution. The balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$250,000. At December 31, 2015 and 2014, the Corporation's cash balances were fully insured.

NOTE 4 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Corporation has evaluated subsequent events through the issuance date of the report. None were considered material to the issued financial statement.
